**1. ORDINANCE NO. 1034; AN ORDINANCE OF  
THE CITY OF RED BLUFF MODIFYING RED  
BLUFF CITY CODE SECTION 13.19(B)  
ADDING ANGLED PARKING TO A PORTION  
OF THE WEST SIDE OF THE 700 BLOCK OF  
WASHINGTON STREET**

**Recommendation:**

That the City Council waive the second reading and adopt Ordinance of the City of Red Bluff modifying Red Bluff City Code Section 13.19(B) adding angled parking to a portion of the west side of the 700 Block of Washington Street.

The Downtown Red Bluff Business Association (DRBBA) has requested that the City consider permitting diagonal parking along the west side of

Washington Street between Walnut and Pine streets (the 700 Block of Washington). The proposal would create approximately 10 additional on-street parking spaces.

## **2. EXTENSION OF THE ABANDONED VEHICLE ABATEMENT PROGRAM**

### **Recommendation:**

That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 22-2014, authorizing the extension of the Tehama County Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Service Fee until March 31, 2025.

In 2004, pursuant to Section 22710 of the California Vehicle Code, the Tehama County Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Service Authority was formed comprising the County of Tehama and cities of Red Bluff, Corning and Tehama. A one dollar (\$1.00) annual vehicle

registration fee was imposed on eligible vehicles registered in Tehama County. The Vehicle Code allows the Service Authority a life span of ten years, which may be extended by ten-year increments. During the current ten-year operational period more than 2,142 nuisance vehicles were abated.

Scot Timboe, Interim Community Development Director, reviewed the staff report and provided staff's recommendation that the City Council waive the second reading and adopt Ordinance No. 1032, an Ordinance clarifying the role and composition of the Technical Advisory Committee.

The proposed Ordinance would clarify the composition and role of the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and delegate authority to TAC for approval of most special event permits.

**2. RED BLUFF RIVER FRONT PARK BOAT LAUNCHING FACILITY PROJECT (SACRAMENTO RIVER BOATING ACCESS) - PHASE 2, AND THE ASSOCIATED INITIAL STUDY/MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION (SCH #2014072008)**

Scot Timboe, Interim Community Development Director, asked that the City Council accept any public comment regarding this project, but table adoption of Resolution No. 21-2014, approving the Red Bluff River Front Park Boat Launching Facility

Project (Phase 2) along with the approval of the associated Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (SCH# 2014072008) until the meeting of August 19<sup>th</sup> to allow the consultants to review and answer comments received from various agencies.

The proposed Project consists of constructing an ADA---compliant reinforced concrete parking lot and a 2-lane boat ramp (110 feet long with a 12 percent slope, and two 15-foot wide lanes with a 8-foot wide boarding float and/or raised walkway) designed for motorized boats at the newly established (post-Lake Red Bluff) rivers edge. The proposed facility essentially provides boating access to the Sacramento River via a two lane 200 ft. long pave access road through the grass area of the park, replacing the existing boat ramp that formerly provided boating access to Lake Red Bluff. The Project is also enhancing parking opportunities by providing 24 new boat trailer spaces, one new Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant vehicle space, and one ADA-compliant vehicle/trailer space. In addition, it provides an asphalt-concrete overlay of the 36 existing vehicle/trailer spaces and 16 existing vehicle-only spaces.

The existing restrooms will be replaced with new restrooms that meet current accessibility requirements. A picnic pavilion and two picnic sites will be constructed in the park portion of the Project area. An existing lakeside pedestrian path will be relocated closer to the river's edge, providing a required ADA-compliant path of travel between the parking lot, restrooms, and picnic pavilion. The relocated path will also provide a required ADA--  
-compliant path of travel between the proposed motorized ramp and the non-motorized ramp. The areal extent of the proposed facilities, once fully constructed, is expected to be approximately 120,000 square feet (2.75 acres).
