C. CURRENT BUSINESS

1. Approval of Minutes – August 12

Commissioner Martin moved to accept the minutes from June 10th. Second by Commissioner Reyes. Ayes 3 Noes 0 Absent 1

2. Dog Park Fundraising/Promotion

Supervisor Hurton reported he had been unable to gain access to the Red Bluff Dog Park facebook page. He has created a new one.

Supervisor Hurton reminded the commission that the City Council agreed to the dog park on the condition of an annual donation toward operations costs of \$1000, in addition to the initial

building of the park. The commission discussed the idea of a steel donation receptacle as part of the park design.

D. STAFF REPORTS

1. Recreation Report

Supervisor Hurton reported that the City Council has approved supplemental appropriations sufficient to balance the Recreation Department budget for 2014-2015. He also presented projections of revenues and expenses for 2015-2016. Projections indicate that the Recreation Department might exceed budget in revenues and expenses.

Hurton presented the concept of celebrating the 80th season of operation for the McGlynn Pool which will be the 2016 Summer. Commissioners Martin and Phillips questioned whether the public might be confused about celebrating *during* the entire 80th season as opposed to waiting until summer 2017 to celebrate the *completion* of 80 years in June 2017.

E. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Commissioner Jensen suggested looking into providing security lighting to help deter vandalism of the train playground at Diamond Park.

Commissioner Phillips suggested that Parks & Recreation might profit from a fair booth.

Chairperson Philips adjourned the meeting at 8:05 p.m.
